ARTICLE XXIII.

Constables.

See 1865, c. 67, under article 38, "Fees of Officers," sub-title, "Constables," regulating the fees of constables.

1867, c. 375, continues 1865, c. 67, in force till April 1, 1869.

1868, c. 317, continues same act in force till April 1, 1870.

1870, c. 196, extends said act till April 1, 1872; and by 1872, c. 424, is continued in force until modified or repealed by the General Assembly.

1865, c. 41, makes valid acts of justices of the peace and constables who failed to qualify under the new constitution, within the time required; and who have been re-appointed, and since qualified according to law.
