50. Any person holding a first grade teacher's certificate, or the Id 8 5 Lafe certificate diploma of a respectable college, or of a State normal school, who has been a teacher for seven years, of which five shall have been spent in the State of Maryland, may apply to the State board of education for a life certificate, which if granted shall exempt him from any further examinations; said certificate may be annulled by said board at any time on account of immoral or unprofessional conduct.

51. The salaries of teachers of each county shall be fixed by the 1d = 6board of county school commissioners.

PUPILS.

52. All white youth between the ages of six and twenty-one id c 9,8 1. years shall be admitted into the public schools of the State, the studies of which they may be able to pursue; provided, that whenever there are graded schools the teachers and board of district school trustees shall determine to which school pupils shall be admitted.

55. Every child, before being admitted to any public school, Id s 4 shall produce a certificate from a regular physician that he has been Vaccination properly vaccinated.

56. Schoolbooks shall contain nothing of a sectarian or partisan Id c 10, s 1 character.

57. Each board of county school commissioners shall adopt, and 1874, c. 463, c 10, may purchase the textbooks for the public schools in their respecting the Purchase of tive counties.

58. The board of county school commissioners shall authorize 1872, c 377, c. 10, the delivery of books and stationery to the various schools in the Payment for county, under such rules and regulations as they may adopt. pupil shall be required to pay more than one dollar quarterly for use of said books and stationery; but any pupil, on account of pecuniary inability, may be exempted from payment by the board of district school trustees; provided, nevertheless, that parents or pupils may purchase their own books when they may think proper.
