

**84.** Any person violating the provisions of the preceding section, shall be liable to indictment by the grand jury of the county where the offence is committed, and shall upon conviction before any judge of any of the Circuit Courts of this State, be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, for each and every offence; one-half of the fine shall be paid the informer, the other half to the county commissioners for the use of public roads.

BETTING ON ELECTIONS.

**85.** No person shall make any bet or wager on the result of any election to take place in this State.

**86.** Any person offending against the last preceding section, shall be liable to indictment in the Circuit Courts, if the offence be committed in any county, or in the Criminal Court of Baltimore, if the offence be committed in Baltimore; and on conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty nor more than five hundred dollars, to be paid to the State for the use of the school fund.

**87.** Every deposit of money in any part of the State, as a wager or bet upon elections in this State or elsewhere, shall be forfeited and paid over to the county commissioners of the county where deposited, for the use of the county, and if deposited in the city of Baltimore, to the mayor and city council.
