16. In case of loss of tag issued by said constable to any person for his dog, a duplicate may be furnished for said dog on payment of ten cents, and satisfactory evidence being furnished that the tax had been paid for the current year on said dog.

Forfeiture of office by con-stable for neglect

17. The neglect of any constable to perform the duties required by the five preceding sections, shall be sufficient cause of forfeiture of office, and the boards of county commissioners of the several counties of this State, are hereby directed to immediately remove from office any constable within their respective counties who shall so neglect to perform said duties

1. When any person shall discover, take up and secure any flatboat or any other vessel driven from any place of mooring, landing, harbor or river, or from any other vessel, he shall, within ten days thereafter, give notice thereof to some justice of the peace for the county where such flat-boat or other vessel is taken up and secured, and the justice shall deliver to the party giving such notice an advertisement, describing in the best manner the build and marks of such flat-boat or vessel and the name of such person and place of his abode, copies of which advertisement the said party shall, within ten days after the date thereof, cause to be set up in the most public places of the county, and, within thirty days after such date, procure the same to be inserted in some daily newspaper published in the
