TELEGRAPH BETWEEN HOUSE OF CORRECTION AND PENITENTIARY
AND THE POLICE HEADQUARTERS IN BALTIMORE CITY.

97. The governor shall, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoint one superintendent of the lines of telegraph authorized to be constructed by the act of 1878, c. 232, who shall supervise the operation of the said lines, which shall be worked at no other cost to the State than that of repairing them and maintaining their efficiency, except the salary of the superintendent of said lines of telegraph, which shall be fifteen hundred dollars a year.

HOUSE OF CORRECTION.

98. There shall be established at some accessible point, near the city of Baltimore, or at such point as the board of public works and attorney-general may select, an institution to be called the Maryland House of Correction, which shall be under the control of the board of managers hereinafter provided for.

99. The State board of managers shall consist of the following persons: The board of public works, who shall always be *ex-officio* members of the board, the attorney-general, and the persons named in the act of 1878, c. 415, and their successors appointed as provided in the next succeeding section hereof; and they shall be a body corporate under the title of the Board of Managers of the Maryland House of Correction, and have power to make such by-laws, rules, and regulations, not inconsistent with law, as they may deem necessary and proper for the public welfare and the best interest of the institution and its inmates; and shall also have power to appoint the necessary officers and agents, and fix their compensation, who shall be removable at their pleasure; and shall make an annual report, on the first Monday in January in each and every year, of their proceedings to the governor of the State, who shall submit the same, with such recommendations as he may deem proper, to the General Assembly, at its next session thereafter.

100. Upon the expiration of each of the terms of office of the board of managers hereinbefore provided for, the governor shall, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoint three persons, residents of this State, to serve without compensation for the term of two years from the first Monday of May next ensuing their appointment, and until their successors are qualified, and
