The release or receipt of a woman over the age of eighteen years to any person or persons, body corporate or body politic for any money paid, property delivered or obligation satisfied, shall be a good and valid discharge of such person or persons, body corporate or body politic, in the same manner and to the same extent as releases or receipts of the same character are now by law good and valid when executed and delivered by persons of the full age of twenty-one years.
