

ceding, shall elect on the first Monday of April in every second year, accounting from the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, at the usual place of holding elections in said town, five commissioners for said town, who shall have resided within the limits of the same for one year next preceding the election.

91. Said elections shall be held and conducted as shall from time to time be directed by the laws of the corporation, not inconsistent with the provisions of this sub-title of this article.

92. The said commissioners, on the first meeting after said election, shall choose some one of their number president of the board, whose duty it shall be to preside at their meetings, and preserve order and give such direction as may be deemed necessary by them to carry into effect the provisions of this sub-title of this article.

93. They may meet together from time to time as often as occasion may require, upon the business of the town, and not less than once in six months, and if during the time for which they may be elected, any of the commissioners should die, resign, remove from the said town, or be otherwise disqualified, an election to fill such vacancy on ten days' notice thereof being given by the commissioners, shall be held, at which all persons qualified as is specified in section 90, shall be entitled to vote.

94. They shall have power to appoint a clerk and assign his duties, and allow him such compensation for his services as they may think proper, and all ordinances passed by said commissioners shall be entered by their clerk in a book to be kept by him for the purpose, and shall be open at all times for the inspection of any person interested.

95. All fines and forfeitures, under the ordinances of the said corporation shall be recoverable as small debts are recoverable before any justice of the peace.
