

make or sign any prescription for such liquor, except as aforesaid, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of said sections, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than two hundred dollars for the first offence, and not less than two hundred dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars for each subsequent offence, one-half of said fine to be paid to the informer and the balance to be paid to the board of public school commissioners of said county, for the use of the said public schools, and be committed to the county jail until such fine and costs of the same are paid; nor shall anything herein be construed to prohibit a sale by such pharmacist or druggist, in case of extreme illness, when delays may be dangerous to the patient.

303. The clerk of the circuit court shall not grant a license to any person to sell spirituous or fermented liquors of any kind at any time or place within two and one-half miles of "Brook Hill Meeting House;" and any person selling any kind of intoxicating drinks, whether of original manufacture or of a mixed character, within the above described limits shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to all the fines and penalties provided by article 56 of the code of public general laws title "Licenses" for selling spirituous or fermented liquors without license.

304. The clerk of the circuit court shall not grant a license to any person to sell spirituous, vinous or malt liquors of any kind, at any time or place within three miles of the post-office, in the village of Hansonville; and any person selling any kind of intoxicating drinks within the above described limits, shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to the fines and penalties prescribed by said article 56 of the code of public general laws title "Licenses" for selling spirituous or fermented liquors without license.

305. It shall not be lawful for the clerk of the circuit court to issue license to any person to sell spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at Buckeystown, or at any place nearer than two miles in every direction from Buckeystown, unless for medicinal purposes, and upon the prescription of a regular physician.
