apparatus or engines shall be actually employed and used in the business of manufacturing in said village; provided, such abatement or exemption shall be extended to all persons, firms or corporations engaged in the branch of manufacturing industry proposed to be benefited by ordinances under the provision of this section.

337. They shall have power and authority to authorize and permit, and by ordinance to grant to any railroad company whose road enters, or is intended to enter the corporate limits of Mechanicstown, the right and privilege of laying down and constructing its track, and of building and grading its road along, through and over any of the streets, lanes or alleys of said village, subject to such regulations as may be prescribed in the ordinances granting such right and privileges of laying down and constructing such track, and building and grading such road along, over and through any street, lane or alley of said village.

338. The board of commissioners, from time to time, under such conditions as they by their ordinances direct, may appoint such officers as they may deem necessary to carry into effect their ordinances, among whom shall be a town bailiff, who shall ex officio be collector of the town tax, and shall, within said village, have all the authority of a constable.

339. The bailiff shall give bond, to be approved by the county commissioners, as other constables, for the faithful performance of his duty as constable, and also a bond to the board of town commissioners, for the faithful performance of such duties as shall be imposed on him by the ordinances of the board of commissioners.

340. The bailiff may enforce the payment of corporation taxes in the same manner and with like effect as collectors may enforce payment of State and county taxes.
