No person elected and qualified as mayor or member of the council shall, during the time for which he was elected, hold any other office of profit or trust created or to be created by the mayor and council of Oakland, or by any law relating to said town, or hold any employment or position, the compensation of which shall be paid directly or indirectly out of the town treasury; nor shall any such person be interested either directly or indirectly in any contract to which the town is a party; nor shall it be lawful for any person holding any office under the town, to be interested, while holding such office, in any contract to which the town is a party.
