297. Appeal allowed from decisions of justices under provisions of this sub-title; stay of judgment, bond required for
298. Violation of sections 278 to 300; penalty.
299. Justices of Harford, Cecil and Kent counties to have concurrent jurisdiction in all cases arising under this sub-title.
300. When lawful to anchor any vessel, sink-box or sneak-boat northward of line mentioned in section 278; when lawful to go on or over said waters when engaged in gunning, penalty.
301. Authority of commander of State police force
302. Persons using, selling or having in their possession any sink-boat, sneak-boat, float or swivel or big gun, for purpose of shooting water fowl in waters of county; penalty.
303. Shooting in night-time in, on or over the waters mentioned in this sub-title; penalty.
304. Persons erecting in said waters, booby blinds at greater distance than 100 yards from shore; penalty.
305. Failure to pay fines imposed by four preceding sections, penalty.
