9. They may make and establish such rules for the the relief, regulation and labor of the poor, and for the good government of the almshouse in said county, not contrary to law, as to them shall from time to time appear most fit and requisite.

10. They shall meet between the first and the tenth days of November, yearly, and appoint a fit person to be overseer of the almshouse in said county, and other proper officers and servants necessary for carrying on the business of said corporation.
