the duties required of him under the provisions of the preceding section, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be liable to presentment and indictment, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for not less than thirty days, nor more than ninety days, or both, in the discretion of the court before which he shall be tried and convicted, the said fine to be applied to the road fund of the county.

Any supervisor who shall fail or neglect to perform his duties under the provisions of section 201, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be liable to presentment and indictment by the grand jury, and on conviction shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than fifty dollars, in the discretion of the court, said fine to be applied to the said road fund.

204. The county commissioners shall require an accurate return to be made annually to the treasurer of the county, of all dogs over the age of two months, possessed by each person and kept about each house.
