

guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in said county, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty dollars, and on refusal to pay said fine, shall be committed by such justice of the peace to the jail of the county until the same is paid.

136. The fines collected under the preceding section shall be paid by the officer collecting the same to the school commissioners of the county, for school purposes.

137. Any constable of said county, or the sheriff thereof, who shall refuse to arrest any person violating any provision of section 135, upon information of such offence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before the circuit court for said county, shall be fined not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars, and shall forthwith be discharged from office.

FENCES.

138. All division fences between the lands of different proprietors in Prince George's county, which may be necessary for their mutual protection, shall be made and repaired at the joint and equal expense of the parties interested.

139. All such division fences, if made of post and rails, or plank, or with caps and stakes, shall be four feet and a half high; all worm division fences shall be five feet high, made of good and sound rails, staked and ridered, and substantially built; but no person shall be required to fence against swine.

140. If either of the parties shall refuse or neglect to make or keep in good repair his portion of said division fence after twenty days' notice shall have been given to him, his agent, tenant or representative, by the person aggrieved, the person so aggrieved
