327. If the owner of any geese or swine impounded under the preceding section, shall prove to the satisfaction of any justice of the peace residing in said town, that the said geese or swine did not go at large from negligence or want of care on his part, and that due diligence was used to prevent it, the owner shall have return of the property on paying all expenses of keeping and proving the same.

328. The keeper of the standards of weights and measures, in Prince George's county, shall receive an annual salary of eighty dollars.

329. It shall not be lawful for any persons, not actual residents of Prince George's, Charles, Anne Arundel, Calvert and St. Mary's counties, to shoot or trap upon the waters of the Patuxent river, its tributaries, or the marshes bordering upon the same, any goose, duck, snipe, ortolan or other wild fowl.

330. Any person who may be found violating the provisions of the preceding section, shall, upon conviction thereof before a justice of the peace of the county wherein the offence was committed, be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, for the first offence, and not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and any subsequent offence; and the boat, gun, ammunition, and all other property found in the possession or use of such person at the time of the
