The clerk of the circuit court shall, annually, on or before the first Monday in April, furnish to and lay before said commissioners, copies of all such lists, accounts, papers and documents as may be useful and necessary to them in ascertaining the county charges, according to the directions he may from time to time receive from them; and on failure or refusal to comply herewith when required by said commissioners, or their clerk by their order, he shall forfeit to them, for the use of the county the sum of one hundred dollars, to be recovered by indictment in the circuit court for said county.

48. Whenever they shall elect or designate one of their number as treasurer, it shall be the duty of said treasurer, before assuming any of the duties of his said office, to present his bond to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of at least ten thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of all the duties imposed upon him as said treasurer, according to law, which said bond shall be approved by the clerk of the circuit court for Somerset county, and when so approved shall be filed with and recorded among the land records of said county.
