121. Washington, Somerset, Queen Anne's, Montgomery, Dorchester, Allegany, St. Mary's, Calvert, Caroline, Carroll, Prince George's, Wicomico, Worcester, Kent, Garrett and Cecil counties, and Baltimore city, and all cities, towns or boroughs in which dogs are taxed by municipal ordinance, are exempted from the operation of sections 157-162 of article 81 of the code of public general laws, title "Revenue and Taxes," providing for the taxation of dogs in this State.

ELECTION DISTRICTS.

P. L. L., (1860,) art. 21, sec. 91.

122. Washington county is divided into twenty-three election districts, according to their present names, bounds and limits, and all elections for public officers shall be held in the said districts, at the places therein heretofore established by law for that purpose.

123. The county commissioners shall have power and authority to create new election districts, in addition to those already established, whenever in their judgment the convenience of the voters of the county or any part thereof will thereby be promoted; and shall also have power to abridge or enlarge any districts heretofore established by the legislature, or which may hereafter be established by said commissioners; and shall have the further power to designate the places of holding the election polls in all election districts.

124. The judges and clerks of election in said county, shall each receive three dollars a day for their services whilst acting as such.

FENCES.

125. All fields and grounds kept for enclosures in said county, shall be fenced with post and rail, or plank or worm fences, well staked and ridered, made of good and substantial rails at least four feet and a half high from the ground to the top of the upper rail; all worm fences shall be at least five feet high from
