When deemed necessary the trustees may require such badge as they may select to be worn in an open and visible manner on the arm or shoulder of any inmate of the almshouse; and if any inmate shall neglect or refuse to wear such badge, he or she shall be subject to such moderate and proper punishment as the trustees may see fit to inflict.
