The limits of the village shall extend to the distance of one-half of a mile from the centre of the bridge leading across the river in either direction, and all that part of said village which, prior to the act of 1880, chapter 208, was situated in Dorchester county, is now transferred to and included within Caroline county; and the property within said limits shall be liable to taxation in said village.

135. Whenever joint fences are established for the mutual benefit of different owners or possessors of adjoining land, each party shall keep in good repair his respective proportion thereof in manner following, that is to say: all post and rail or plank
