

Election Districts.

- 126. Nine, bounds and limits; where elections are to be held.
- 127. Pay of judges and clerks of election.
- 128. Judges may appoint constables to keep the peace at the polls.

Elkton,

- 129. Inhabitants are a corporation, name; corporate powers; seal.
- 130. Commissioners; their number and election, who are qualified electors.
- 131. Commissioners to designate time and place of holding elections, and give notice thereof, judges of elections; polls open from two to six; who shall be the commissioners.
- 132. Failure to elect one or more commissioners on account of the vote; what to be done.
- 133. If three commissioners not elected or do not assemble, old commissioners to proclaim new election.
- 134. Meetings of commissioners; president, his duties and term; secretary and treasurer; their terms; treasurer's bond.
- 135. Powers of president and commissioners; fines, how recovered; imprisonment in default of payment.
- 136. May provide by ordinance for arrest without warrant, in what cases; intoxicated persons driving through streets.
- 137. Limits of the town; commissioners may establish and extend the same; description of boundaries to be filed.
- 138. Streets, lanes and alleys; powers of commissioners to open or improve; railroad crossings, flagmen, penalties to enforce powers of commissioners, how recovered.
- 139. May make a levy to pay damages and expenses of such improvements.
- 140. Failure for any reason to come to agreement with owners of land needed for such improvements, jury to be summoned.
- 141. If persons summoned shall fail to attend, others to be summoned; names to be stricken off from full panel, by whom.
- 142. Oath to be administered to jurors.
- 143. Benefits only to be taken into consideration in extinguishment of damages; inquisition; its form; to be returned to court; if confirmed by court, to be recorded.
- 144. If inquisition set aside, court to order another.
- 145. What the inquisition must contain, upon payment, commissioners become entitled; receipt by owner of valuation after refusal to receive.
- 146. Taxes.
- 147. Appeal from assessment.
- 148. Officers to carry into effect ordinances, bailiff, his election, powers and duties; the vote; vacancy in office of bailiff, how filled.
- 149. Bailiff to give two bonds.
- 150. His powers in collection of taxes.
- 151. Oath to be taken by commissioners.
- 152. President of the commissioners, his powers and duties, public statement to be made by commissioners.
- 153. Streets of the town as part of county roads; levy by county to keep in repair.
- 154. In case of neglect on part of inhabitants of town to make elections, power not to cease, old commissioners to hold over.
