ceived by the collectors in payment of county taxes; and the county commissioners shall, from time to time, levy in advance upon the assessable property of said county such sums as may be necessary for the prompt payment of the semi-annual interest due on said bonds, and also for the payment of the principal thereof when the same may become due, or when they desire to redeem the same; all money levied for the payment of the principal and interest of the same shall be levied for the use of said treasurer; and any collector failing to pay over the said sums so levied prior to the time when the same may be demandable by the said treasurer, may be proceeded against in accordance with the provisions of the preceding section, and be subject to its provisions and penalties.
