for the purpose of fishing the same or for any other purpose—nothing herein contained to be construed to prohibit the fishing with said fish trap or pound nets by bona fide citizens of Charles county from the shores bordering on said rivers and tributaries within said waters, not being near the mouths of said inlets, whereby the fish would be obstructed in their free passage to the head waters of said rivers and tributaries within said county. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be subjected to the fines and penalties as provided in section 69.

78. No person except residents of Charles county shall purchase for sale, any hogs or poultry of any description, within the limits of said county, without first obtaining a license from the clerk of the circuit court for said county.

79. Each person, for each license mentioned in the preceding section, shall pay to the clerk the sum of fifty dollars; and the clerk shall account for and pay over the same to the treasurer of the State, at the same time and in the same manner as other money received by him for the use of the State.

80. Any person convicted in the circuit court for Charles county of a violation of the provisions of section 78, shall be fined one hundred dollars, one-half to the use of the State, the other half to the use of the person who shall prosecute the same with effect.

JURORS, WITNESSES, BAILIFFS, CRIER AND MESSENGERS.

81. The pay of jurors attending the circuit court for Charles county shall be two dollars per day, and ten cents for each mile, over five miles, for going to and returning from the court, once in each week, while serving on the jury; the pay of witnesses shall be one dollar per day whilst attending the circuit court
