**92.** The corporate limits of the town shall be as follows: Beginning at a tree at Mathews' gate and running south five hundred yards; thence northeast to a locust tree on farm of John Chapman's land; thence northwest eight hundred yards to a white-oak tree at Farrall's mill; then across in a straight line to the commencing point.

**93.** The citizens of said town, having resided therein six months and in the State twelve months previous to any election, shall, annually on the first day of May, elect five commissioners of La Plata to serve for one year, or until their successors shall be elected and qualified; the commissioners must be substantial citizens, resident in said corporate limits, and must have resided therein for at least six months next preceding their election; must be owners of real estate within said corporate limits, and continue to reside therein during their term of office.

**94.** The five commissioners elected shall choose one of their number president, and all vacancies in the commissioners shall be filled by an election held after ten days' notice given by the remaining commissioners.

**95.** They shall meet in some convenient place in said town on or before the first Monday of June next succeeding their election, and as often thereafter as may be necessary to discharge the duties of their office.

**96.** They shall annually, on or before the first Monday of April, appoint three judges, who shall conduct the election according to the election laws of the State, except that the polls shall be opened at two o'clock P. M. and closed at six o'clock P. M.; and the judges shall make their return to the commissioners, but shall receive no pay for their services.
