In any town or village where no special health department has been established, the State board of health is hereby empowered to make such rules and regulations in relation to the care and cleansing of privies, pig-pens and other noxious places, as they may deem desirable for the preservation of the health of any of the inhabitants thereof, or the said board may declare any such privy, pig-pen or other noxious place a nuisance, and the abatement thereof be by the said board, or its executive officer, ordered and enforced.

39. Every person not now practising medicine and surgery, who shall hereafter begin to practise medicine and surgery in any of its departments, except dentistry, in the State of Maryland, shall possess the qualifications required by this sub-title of this article.
