1. Any citizen of the United States, or person who has duly declared his intention of becoming such citizen, residing or having a place for the regular transaction of business in the State of Maryland, being over the age of twenty-one years and of good moral character, and who shall have received from the Governor of the State of Maryland a certificate of his qualification to practice as a public expert accountant, as hereinafter provided, shall be styled and known as a certified public accountant; and no other person shall assume such title, or use the abbreviation "C. P. A.," or any other words, letters or figures to indicate that the person using the same is such certified public accountant.

The Governor shall, within sixty days after the enactment of this article, appoint a board of four examiners for the examination of persons applying for certificates thereunder, two of said examiners shall be public accountants, selected from a list of six names proposed by the Maryland association of public accountants, one of which said two examiners shall hold office for the term of one year, and one for the term of two years, and upon the expiration of each of said terms, and of each succeeding term, an examiner shall be appointed for the erm of two years, and after the year nineteen hundred each successor to said two examiners shall be appointed from such persons as may hold certificates as certified public
