138p. What to be deemed sophisticated, adulterated or 11nwholesome milk. Addition of sugar to condensed milk not prohibited, nor sale skimmed milk when marked "skimmed milk." Feeding of ensilage from silos.

138E. Sections 138c and 138D not applicable to Montgomery county, except to milk shipped to Baltimore city; not to limit powers of Mayor and City Council over inspection of milk.

sterling silver to contain nine 138f. Manufacture. sale, etc., of condensed or preserved milk; penalty.
