

- 103. Duty of secretary of either or both boards of medical examiners as to violations of this sub-title.
- 104. Authority of board of medical examiners as to collection and disbursement of funds.
- 105. Penalty for practising under another name.
- 106. License may be revoked by vote of five; appeal.

State Veterinary Medical Board.

- 107. Appointment, qualifications and powers of such board.
- 108. Requirements of persons practising veterinary medicine or surgery.
- 109. Meetings of said board
- 110. Such board to examine diplomas and hold examinations
- 111. Examination of applicants.
- 112. Who to be regarded as practising veterinary surgery.

Adulteration of Food and Drink.

- 122. Mixing food or drink with color or stain. Sale of such mixed food or drink.

- 123. Mixing glucose or grape sugar with syrup, honey or sugar, or oleomargarine, suine or beef fat with butter or cheese without labeling, unlawful. Exception.
- 124. Deleterious adulteration of vinegar, wine, spirituous or malt drinks unlawful.
- 125. Penalty for such adulteration.
- 126. Penalty for selling diseased or decayed poultry, meats, fruits, or vegetables.
- 127. Duty of State board of health in carrying out the provisions of this sub-title.
- 128. Power of said board to forbid sale of deleterious or unsound articles.
- 129. Power of said board to examine live animals and inspect foods and drinks and forbid sale. Penalty for refusing to obey orders of said board.
- 130. State's attorney to appear and prosecute.
- 131. Appropriation for defraying expenses of examination of suspected articles of food and drink.
- 132. Penalty for selling malt extract not to be used as such.
- 133. Time for killing animals.
- 134. Penalty for using methyl or wood alcohol in flavoring extracts.
