All moneys payable to the State on account of the public lands and all fees shall be paid to the commissioner of the land office, whose receipts therefor shall be a good acquittance to the party paying the same; and the said commissioner shall keep an accurate account of all such payments in a book kept for the purpose, and shall account semi-annually on the thirty-first day of March and the thirtieth day of September with the comptroller, on oath, and pay over to the treasurer all such moneys so received; and twenty-five per cent. of such moneys so received the treasurer shall pay over on warrant of the comptroller semi-annually to the commissioner of the land office.
