

or other place for the care and custody of the insane or idiotic except upon the written certificates of two qualified physicians of the State of Maryland made within one week after separate examination by them of said alleged lunatic and setting forth the insanity or idiocy of such person and the reason for such opinion. No certificate shall be of force which shall be presented for the commitment of any patient more than thirty days after date of examination. The form of physician's certificate shall be substantially as follows :

I further certify that I am not related by blood or marriage to the said _____ nor in any way connected as medical attendant or otherwise with the hospital or other establishment in which it is proposed to place the aforesaid _____, and that this certificate is signed and made within one week of the examination of the patient.

32. It shall not be lawful for any physician to certify to the insanity of any person for the purpose of committing such person to confinement in an asylum or other place where the insane are kept with which said physician may be in any manner connected or in which he may be in anywise interested.

All superintendents or other officers of any asylum or other institution where the insane are kept in custody or received for treatment, whether public, corporate or private, or almshouse, shall, within ten days after the reception of such patient or person, make or cause to be made a description of such case in a book kept exclusively for the purpose ; they
