ARTICLE XCVI.

UNITED STATES.

- Consent to purchase of lands by; deeds to be recorded as in other cases.
- Governor to convey title and 'cede jurisdiction where the 'land is covered by navigable water.
- 3. Such land exempt from taxation.
- 4. State to have concurrent jurisdiction.
- Condemnation of land for such purposes.
- 6. What must be stated in petition for condemnation.
- 7. Petition to be verified by affidavit.
- 8 Publication of notice of petition.
- 9. Proceedings; jury; notice to owner.
- In case of absence of jurors;
 each party to strike off four.
- 11. Oath of jurors
- Jury to summon witnesses, take testimony and determine the compensation.
- Inquisition to be reduced to writing, sealed and returned to court.
- 14. Confirmation by court; costs.
- 15. New inquisition.
- 16. Statements in inquisition; title to pass upon payment; payment into court.
- 17 Jurisdiction.
- 18. Exemption from taxation.
- Consent of the State given to purchase land by United States for forts, magazines, arsenals, coast defences, barracks or other buildings, deed to be recorded.

- United States may institute condemnation proceedings.
- 21. Sections 17 and 18 to apply to cases under sections 19 and 20

Public Buildings and Land.

- 22 Consent of State to purchase of lot in Laurel, Prince George's county.
- 23. Jurisdiction over such lot ceded to United States; proviso.
- 24. Jurisdiction over government hospital for the insane in Prince George's county.
- 25 Over certain land in Cumberland.
- 26. Ceded to the United States over land now or hereafter acquired; period for which grant shall continue; condition.

Claims of the State Against the United States.

- 27. Governor shall appoint agent or agents to prosecute such claims; compensation to be contingent; how to be fixed.
- 28. Vacancies, how filled.
- 29. Compensation of agents, how to be paid.

Antietam Battlefield Commission.

30 Said commission may transfer to United States its lot on Antietam battlefield.
