When any person shall be convicted of larceny in any court of this State and such court shall be of the opinion that the interest of public justice will be best promoted by sentencing the person so convicted to the house of correction instead of the penitentiary, it shall have power to sentence such person to be confined in the house of correction instead of the penitentiary; provided, that the said term of confinement in the said house of correction shall not be for a less period than may now or hereafter be lawfully imposed for the offense of which such person was so convicted, and that such person so sentenced to confinement in said house of correction be not sentenced to be confined therein for a longer period than three years.
