of the peace of the city or county of the State of Maryland wherein the owner or owners reside, or the respective building or buildings may be located, they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall pay a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100) or less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each offense, and an additional fine of five dollars (\$5) for each and every day thereafter such violations shall continue; and if the accused shall feel himself aggrieved by the judgment of the justice of the peace he shall have the right of appeal to the circuit court for the county and have a jury trial; this sub-title shall, however, not conflict with any existing laws now fully covering the same in any of the towns or cities of the State of Maryland.

**206.** The entire expenses of the office hereby created shall not exceed fifty-five hundred dollars (\$5,500) a year, which shall be paid out of moneys paid into the State treasury by or for the insurance companies doing business in this State; and immediately upon the qualification of the fire marshal, as provided herein, the treasurer of the State shall, upon the warrant of the comptroller, pay to the said fire marshal the sum of twenty-seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,750) and the like sum at the expiration of each succeeding period of six months, and out of the moneys thus by said fire marshal received, he shall pay himself a salary of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500) per annum, payable in monthly instalments; and he shall have the power and authority and shall appoint a deputy fire marshal, who shall also act as clerk to the fire marshal, and who shall have all the powers and authority herein enumerated and granted to him, to whom the said fire marshal shall pay the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200) as a salary per annum, also payable in equal monthly instalments; he shall also be allowed out of said moneys a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500) a year for office rent, and may from time to time employ such other clerical and other assistants, and provide himself and the deputy fire marshal with such means of conveyance as in his judgment the necessities of the office require; and when in the proper discharge of their duties the said fire marshal and deputy fire marshal shall be compelled to go outside of the limits of the city of Baltimore or the place of their residence, they shall be allowed their traveling,
