CHAPTER 86.

AN ACT to relieve the disabilities of J. Hooper Shepherd, a minor.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That J. Hooper Shepherd, an infant resident of this State, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to settle with the surviving administrator of Caleb Shepherd, deceased, and the administrator of E. Priscilla Shepherd, deceased, all of this State, for whatever share of the personal estate of said decedents may of right belong to him, and to execute a receipt or receipts for the same, and the said administrators are hereby authorized to pay over and deliver to him whatever moneys or other personal property may be now or shall hereafter become legally due him from said personal estates, and take his receipt or receipts therefor, which shall have the same effect as if the same were executed by a person of full age.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said J. Hooper Shepherd shall have the immediate right to take charge of his own real estate, and to contract, and shall be answerable in law and equity for all liabilities, debts and contracts entered into by him, and may sue and be sued as if he were a man of full age.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
