

on the first Monday in the month of June next, and on the first Monday of June every two years thereafter; the said judges of election shall appoint one clerk; and the holding of such election shall be regulated and governed by the same law as is now applicable to State elections, except the hours for holding such election shall be from nine o'clock A. M. to five o'clock P. M.

Legal voters
to elect

SUB-SECTION 1. All such legal voters as pay a corporation tax to the authorities of the town, having resided therein twelve months previous to any election, shall, on the first Monday in June next and every two years thereafter on the same day, elect three commissioners for Rockville, to serve for two years from the date of their elections, and until their successors are elected and qualified; the commissioners must be substantial citizens, residents in said corporate limits, and must have resided therein for at least four years next preceding their election, and continue to do so during their continuance in office; they shall receive no pay for their services, except the president, who shall receive the fees hereinafter allowed.

Highest number
to elect.

SUB-SECTION 2. The judges of election shall give certificates of election to the three persons receiving the highest number of votes, and such certificates shall be final as to all questions of election.

Who to be
president.

SUB-SECTION 3. The person receiving the highest number of votes shall be the president of the commissioners, and all vacancies in the commissioners shall be filled by an election held after ten days' notice given by the remaining commissioners.

Appoint
judges of
election.

SUB-SECTION 4. The commissioners for the town of Rockville, elected under the provisions of this act, shall appoint the judges of election for all subsequent elections, and the judges so appointed shall give the required notice, as hereinbefore provided, of the time and place of holding such election.

Effective.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
