

chapter one hundred and eighty-one of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, entitled an act to repeal section twenty-one of article seven of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Carroll county," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," and to re-enact the same with amendments, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter one hundred and ninety-one, be and the same are hereby repealed, and said section twenty-one of article seven of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Carroll county," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," be and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SECTION 21. There shall be the following number of Justices of the Peace and Constables for Carroll county; for election district number one, four Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number two, three Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number three, three Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number four, four Justices of the Peace and three Constables; for election district number five, four Justices of the Peace and three Constables; for election district number six, three Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number seven, five Justices of the Peace and three Constables; for election district number eight, two Justices of the Peace and one Constable; for election district number nine, four Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number ten, two Justices of the Peace and two Constables; for election district number eleven, three Justices of the Peace and one Constable; for election district number twelve, two Justices of the Peace and four Constables.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any act or acts in conflict with the provisions of this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
