

the inquisition under his hand and seal and the hands and seals of the jury to the commissioners, to be recorded among the Land Records of Prince George's county, and the said condemnation shall, upon payment or tender to the owner of the land condemned of the damages assessed by the inquisition, vest the property condemned in the commissioners, but said property shall be in no way disturbed until the damages assessed shall have been paid or tendered.

Vest the property

Judges of first election.

Meet and qualify.

SEC. 16. *And be it enacted*, That the justice or justices of the peace for the time being holding office in said town shall act as judge or judges of the first election to be held under this act, who shall keep the polls open in the afternoon at such place as he or they may select in said town, from three o'clock until six o'clock, and shall, within twenty-four hours after closing the polls, notify, in writing, the three persons having the greatest number of votes, that they have been elected commissioners of the town of Upper Marlborough, and the said commissioners so notified shall thereupon meet and qualify as directed by this act, and take control and management of the town, all subsequent elections to be provided for and regulated by the by-laws of the corporation.

Record acts and ordinances

Posted

SEC. 17. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall cause to be kept a book, in which shall be recorded every ordinance and act passed by said commissioners, which said book shall at all times, under the supervision of the commissioners, or such person as they shall designate, be open to the inspection of the public; all ordinances passed by the commissioners shall be written in a plain hand, or printed and posted at two public places in town, to be determined by the commissioners.

Prohibit firing and meetings

SEC. 18. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners may, by ordinance, prohibit the firing of guns and pistols in said town, and may prohibit the tumultuous and irregular meetings of idle and dissolute persons, and shall give general directions to the bailiff to disperse the same by lawful means.
