

lished in said county, once a week for two successive weeks, and by handbills posted in said election district in Somerset county, where said election is to take place, at least ten days before the said election, in which notice a copy of this act shall be inserted, and the expenses of said election, including the notices and handbills aforesaid, shall be levied by the commissioners of said county and paid by the collector thereof.

Make proclamation.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That ballots for or against such sale shall have printed or written upon them the words "for restricted license to sell spirituous or fermented liquors," or "against license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors," and the ballots so cast shall be carefully counted by the judges of said election, and that said judges shall make a return of said votes to the clerk of the Circuit Court for Somerset county, and said clerk shall immediately make proclamation of the result of said election.

Majority vote to decide.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That if it shall be found by said returns of judges of election, and proclamation of said clerk, that a majority of said votes in said district hereinbefore mentioned have been cast against license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors, that then, and in that event, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons or body corporate, in the said district, to sell intoxicating, spirituous or fermented liquors, except cider and home-made wines, on the premises where manufactured, in quantities not less than a gallon, after the first day of May next; and any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon indictment and conviction therefor, be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, and be imprisoned in the county jail sixty days for each and every offence; and it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace, upon information received and confirmed by the oath of a credible witness, to have any person violating any of the provisions of this section arrested and committed to the county jail, unless he or they shall give sufficient bail, or recognizance with sureties, to be approved by said justice,

Fine for violation.
