same by measure in any quantity not less than one pint in accordance with the license issued under the provisions of this act, which liquor thus sold by measure shall not be allowed by said storekeeper to be used on his premises.

By measure.

Sub-Section F. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of sub section E of this act, shall upon indictment and conviction therefor, be fined not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars for the first offence, and for each offence thereafter, he shall be fined as above directed, and also be imprisoned not less than ten nor more than thirty days in the county jail, and his license may be suppressed at the discretion of the court.

Penalty for violation.

Sub-Section G. No apothecary or druggist in any of the districts mentioned in this act in Somerset county, shall sell, barter, or keep on his premises, except for the private use of himself and his family, any spirituous liquor, wines, ale, beer, schnapps, or any article used and sold as a beverage in the composition or compounding of which whiskey, brandy, high wines or any spirituous or fermented liquors shall be the principal ingredient or ingredients, and any apothecary or druggist so doing shall, upon indictment and conviction thereof, be fined not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than two hundred dollars; but nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent said druggist from keeping and using alcohol as a solvent for drugs, when such solutions are not to be used as a beverage.

No apothecary shall sell.

Penalty.

Sub-Section H. Any person who shall sell or barter any intoxicating, spirituous or fermented liquor, without first having obtained a license, as required by this act, shall, upon indictment and conviction therefor by the Circuit Court for Somerset county, be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than three hundred dollars, and be sentenced by said court to the county jail for not less than three months nor more than six months; and it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace, upon information received and confirmed by the oath of a credible witness, to have any person so offending arrested and committed to the county jail, unless he shall

Duty of justice of peace.
