

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That any person found trespassing with dog or gun, on any posted or advertised property in said county, or who, upon personal notice to leave, shall refuse to comply or shall return, shall be liable to be arrested by any constable of said county, upon a warrant sworn out by the owner or occupant of said land, and shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in said county, shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than twenty dollars for each offence, and shall stand committed till fine and costs are paid.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the fines which may be collected under the provisions of section four of this act shall be paid by the justice of the peace to the county commissioners of said county.

Disposition of fines.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Commissioners of Talbot county be required to pay a bounty of fifty cents for the scalp of each and every hawk or owl (the fishing hawk excepted) killed in Talbot county, said bounty to be paid in cash by said commissioners upon presentation of the certificate of any justice of the peace of said county that oath has been made before him to the killing of said hawk or owl in said county.

Required to pay bounty.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
