

CHAPTER 154.

AN ACT to incorporate the Annapolis Road Turnpike Company of Baltimore county.

Appointed commissioners. **Books to be opened.**

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Joseph M. Brian, jr., Thomas Pumphrey, William A. Shipley, Patrick O'Brien, and Edward W. Stiefel, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to take subscriptions to the capital stock of the Annapolis Road Turnpike Company, hereby incorporated, and they or a majority of them may cause books to be opened at such times and places, and for such period or periods, upon giving notice as they may deem expedient, of the times and places of opening the same; and if any of such commissioners shall die, resign or refuse to act, another or others may be appointed in his or their stead by a majority of the remaining commissioners.

Company incorporated. **Capable in law.** **Have succession.**

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the subscribers to said stock, their successors and assigns, shall be and they are hereby declared to be incorporated into a company by the name of "The Annapolis Road Turnpike Company of Baltimore county," and by that name shall be capable, in law, of purchasing, holding, selling, leasing and conveying estates, real, personal and mixed, so far as may be necessary for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, and no further, and shall have succession, and by said corporate name may sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal, which they shall have power to alter or renew at their pleasure, and shall have, enjoy and may exercise all the powers, rights and privileges which other corporate bodies may lawfully do, for the purposes mentioned in this act.

Call general meeting.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That when two hundred shares or more of said stock shall have been subscribed, the said commissioners, or a majority of them shall call a general meeting of the subscribers, at such time and place as they may appoint, and shall give at least ten days' public notice thereof, and at such meeting the said commissioners shall lay the subscription books before the subscribers then
