The general staff of the militia shall consist of an adjutant general, with the rank of major general, and salary at the rate of fifteen hundred dollars a year, and a quartermaster general, a commissary general, a chief engineer, a chief of ordnance, a chief of artillery, a chief of cavalry, an inspector general, a paymaster general, a surgeon general, and judge advocate general, who shall have the rank of brigadier general, and shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, and hold office until the appointment and qualification of their successors, or until removed in pursuance of the sentence of a court martial; and the Governor is hereby empowered to appoint such number of aides de-camp, with the rank of colonel, as may be necessary to the discharge of his duties as commander in chief.

CHAPTER 172.
