

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the money which shall be derived from the sale or other disposition of the property aforesaid, or any part thereof, shall be applied by the said Regents, at the discretion of said Faculty of Physic, to the alteration, improvement and equipment of the buildings, or any of them now being upon said property, or the purchase, erection and equipment of other buildings, or to both said purposes; provided always that all the property so purchased, erected, altered, improved or equipped shall be held by said Regents in their name, for the exclusive use and benefit of said Faculty of Physic, to be by it used and applied to the purposes and advancement of medical science and education and the treatment and cure of disease in connection with said University of Maryland, and in conformity with its charter.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 244.

AN ACT to regulate fences in the third election (or Vienna) district of Dorchester county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That all farms, forest and other lands in the third election (or Vienna) district of Dorchester county shall be fenced with posts and rails, logs, planks or worm fences, well staked and ridered and made of good and substantial materials; the said worm and log fences shall be at least four feet high from the ground to the upper rail or log, and the space between the said rails or logs for eighteen inches from the ground shall not exceed four inches, and for the balance of the fence shall not exceed six inches; the planks and all post and rail fences shall be not less than three feet and eight
