

CHAPTER 251.

AN ACT for the relief of William H. Travers of  
Dorchester county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant on the State Treasurer to pay and refund to William H. Travers, of Dorchester county, the sum of fifty dollars, paid by him into the treasury as bondsman of Robert Collins, upon the forfeited recognizance of the latter, who was subsequently apprehended and is now a convict in the State Penitentiary, the same having been recommended by the officers of the Treasury department.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 252.

AN ACT to repeal section ninety-four of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Alleghany County," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section ninety-four of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Alleghany county," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," be and is hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:
