CHAPTER 31.

AN ACT to amend article thirty of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, title "Crimes and Punishments," by adding thereto certain additional sections, under the sub-title of "Tramps."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That article thirty of the Public General Laws of this State, title "Crimes and Punishments," be amended by adding thereto the following additional sections, under the sub-title of "Tramps:"

Amended and additional sections added.

SECTION 1. Every person, not insane, who wanders about in this State and lodges in market-houses, market-places, or in other public buildings, or in barns, out-houses, barracks, sheds, or in the open air, without having any fixed place of residence, and without having any lawful occupation in the city, town or county in which he may so wander, and without having any visible means of support, shall be deemed to be a tramp and to be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be subject to imprisonment in the Maryland House of Correction for a period not less than two months nor more than one year.

Who shall be deemed to be tramps.
