

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the male citizens of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, who have resided in the town of Lonaconing one year preceding the election, shall, on the third Monday of April in each year, at such place as the judges of election herein appointed shall designate within the corporate limits of said town for the election to be held in the year eighteen hundred and eighty, and at such place for succeeding elections as the Mayor and Councilmen of said town shall designate, elect one person residing in said town and having real and personal property therein to the value of five hundred dollars, Mayor of the town of Lonaconing.

Elect Mayor.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the persons qualified as required by the preceding section shall also, at the same time and place, elect six persons who shall have resided in said town one year next preceding said election, and who shall be assessed on the books of said town to a sum not less than one hundred dollars, as Councilmen of said town.

Elect Councilmen.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That James A. Stewart, John O. Hanley and John Mitchell, be and they are hereby appointed judges of election to hold the first election under this act, and that immediately after the passage of this act they shall give at least five days' notice of the time at which said election shall be held, at which election all persons qualified as prescribed in the third and fourth sections of this act shall be entitled to vote for one person for mayor, and six persons for councilmen of said town; and the said judges of election, before opening the polls, shall take an oath before some justice of the peace in said town, to permit every qualified person to vote and none other, and a majority of said three judges shall have power to do all things under this section, in case one of them dies or refuses to act; and the Mayor and Councilmen then elected shall immediately qualify and serve until the first Monday in May, eighteen hundred and eighty-one, or until their successors qualify; all future mayors and councilmen elected according to the preceding sections shall qualify by the first Monday in May, and take possession of their offices the first Monday in May each year.

Judges of election.
