

over which said owner or owners could exercise no control.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not apply to any hogs being driven from point to point on the public roads or public grounds in said election district, when such are under proper guard.

When not to apply.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That any person who shall be found guilty before any justice of the peace of the county aforesaid of purposely turning out any hog or hogs, or of opening any gates, or in any other way aiding any hog or hogs to trespass to the extent of the violation of this act, he shall be liable to a fine of not more than five dollars, to be collected as other fines are collected under this act, or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not exceeding seven days; any fine collected under this section shall be paid, one half to the informer and the other half to the public school fund of the county aforesaid.

CHAPTER 381.

AN ACT to repeal an act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter three hundred and eighteen, entitled "An act passed January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter forty-eight," entitled "An act to regulate the closing of roads in Prince George's county," and to enact the following instead thereof, and re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the act passed at the January session of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter three hundred and eighteen, entitled "An act to repeal an act passed January session, eighteen hun-
