

CHAPTER 408.

AN ACT to repeal chapter one hundred and seventeen of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled "An act to incorporate the town of Huntington, Prince George's county," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Repealed and re-enacted.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That chapter one hundred and seventeen of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled "An act to incorporate the town of Huntington, Prince George's county," be and the same is hereby repealed, amended and re-enacted, so as to read as follows: That the citizens of the town of Huntington, in Prince George's county, are hereby constituted a body corporate, by the name of the Commissioners of Huntington, and by that name may have perpetual succession, sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal.

Limits and extent.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That the limits and extent of said town shall be the same as laid down and platted on the official plat of Huntington as filed and recorded in the office of the clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county.

Extend and enlarge.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said board of commissioners are hereby empowered, whenever requested by a majority of the legal voters within the limits of the proposed extension, to extend and enlarge the limits of said corporation, by having the contemplated extension surveyed and the bounds thereof established, a copy of which survey shall be recorded among the records of the corporation.

Elect three commissioners.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the legal voters of said town, who have resided therein for the space of six months next preceding the third Monday in April next, shall, on that day, at the old post-office, and on the first Monday in April in each and every year thereafter, at such place as may be designated by the board of commissioners, be authorized to elect
