to appropriate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore are hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate such a sum of money as they may deem proper, not exceeding two thousand dollars, for procuring and erecting a new monument, in lieu of the one that was lost, to the memory of Colonel George Armistead, for the purpose of commemorating his eminent military services in defence of his post upon the memorable occasion already referred to, in conformity with the appreciation expressed of those services by the resolution of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore of March fourteenth, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, and that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore are hereby authorized to provide the necessary means for defraying the expenses incidental to carrying this resolution into effect.

CHAPTER 421.

AN ACT to amend the act incorporating the Corn Exchange Building Company in the city of Baltimore, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty, chapter twelve.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section four of the acts passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty, chapter twelve, incorporating the Corn Exchange Building's Company is hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as follows :

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all the affairs, concerns and business of said corporation shall be managed and conducted by and under the direction of seven directors, who shall be stockholders and citizens of this State, and the seven shall be elected by the stockholders,
