appeal within ten days after judgment, and shall within ten days after judgment pay the costs that have accrued, and deliver to said justice of the peace an appeal bond with two or more sureties, to be approved by said justice of the peace, executed to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of double the amount of fine or penalty adjudged by said justice of the peace, said bond to be conditioned for the successful prosecution of said appeal.

Appeal bond.

SEC. 21. And be enacted, That all money paid into the treasury of the State, under the provisions of this act, shall be placed to the credit of the "oyster fund."

Money—how placed.

SEC. 22. And be enacted, That the provisions of this act shall not apply to the citizens of the State of Virginia.

Not to apply.

SEC. 23. And be enacted, That this act shall take effect upon the approval of this act, and the passage of a similar act by the State of Virginia.

CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT to repeal the various Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland authorizing and directing the payment of bounties to volunteers and drafted men mustered into the service of the United States and credited to the State of Maryland during the late war, and to prohibit the further payment of bounties under said acts.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty four, chapter fifteen, entitled "An act to aid and encourage enlist-

Encourage enlistments.
