priated to the said Board of Education; and that the balance of the money, hereby appropriated, shall be paid to the State Board of Education, and be by them disbursed; for the necessary repairs to the Normal School building, one thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be expended by the Board of Public Works; for donation to Colleges, Academies and Schools as per acts and resolutions heretofore passed, forty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; provided that none of the appropriations to Colleges, Academies and Schools, shall be paid to any of said institutions except such as shall have made a full report as required by section four of article eighty-four of the Code of Public General Laws; to the Deaf and Dumb Asylum at Frederick, for the education of deaf and dumb, twenty-five thousand dollars; to the Deaf and Dumb Asylum at Frederick, being the amount omitted in the appropriation bill for eighteen hundred and seventy-nine and eighteen hundred and eighty, to be paid this fiscal year, five thousand dollars; to the Maryland Agricultural College, five thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine dollars; to St. Mary's Industrial School, twelve thousand five hundred dollars; to the Maryland Industrial School for Girls, thirteen thousand dollars, ten thousand dollars thereof for the construction of a new building.

#### REFORMATORY AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS.

For reformatory and other institutions.

To the Maryland Penitentiary, for the support of the institution, ten thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be applied under the direction of the Governor, for the instruction of the indigent blind, in accordance with the provisions of the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, chapter two hundred and five; to the Board of Directors of the Maryland Institution for the Education of the Deaf and Dumb and the Blind colored children of the State, eight thousand five hundred dollars; to the Lying-in Hospital for Indigent Women, three thousand dollars; to the House of Refuge, twenty-five thousand dollars, ten thousand of which is to go for repairs and renovation of
